To help us accommodate the large number of entries expected again this year, please indicate your penning requirements on the entry form. For example, are you exhibiting on behalf of several stud names? Do you prefer to pen your animals in groups rather than separately?

We will attempt to arrange inspections on arrival.

Due to increasing space restrictions, and in line with the requirements of the National Show and similar requirements in other Regions, sanctions will be imposed on exhibitors who fail to exhibit animals entered, if an acceptable explanation is not provided to the Show Committee via the Convenor.

- **Fleeces must be lodged with the Fleece Steward by 8:30am on Saturday 18 June**
- **Judging of Suris will start on Saturday 18 June at 9:30 am sharp.**
- **Judging of Huacayas will start on completion of Suris and will be continued at 9:30am on Sunday 19 June.**
- **Premier Colours will be judged immediately after judging of Supreme Suri or Huacaya.**
- **Presentations will be made after completion of all Judging.**
- **There will be no Exhibitors' meeting – changes to the program will be advised on the noticeboard.**

In addition to the Show program, we are encouraging a vibrant trade involvement by offering trade pens and discounted trade stands. Sales from trade pens may include animals and product. Provided there is sufficient space the trade pens will be interspersed with the show pens on the arena floor. The trade stands are located on the concourse overlooking the arena. We expect craft and spinning demonstrations will again be included.

The show ring will again be located centrally this year to help focus activity within the pavilion and ease the marshalling efforts of exhibitors. To that end walkways must be kept clear! No personal items (eg. chairs, displays, etc) will be permitted in the walkways.

AlpacaFest Dinner – Saturday 18 June:

We've a new venue for the 2011 AlpacaFest Dinner – ShadowFax Winery. The winery is adjacent to the Werribee Park Equestrian Centre in K Road. We combine a wine tasting (& possibly a winery tour for those interested) an informal meal in the warmth of their facilities.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

This Show will be conducted under the Rules of the Australian Alpaca Association Ltd. as set out in the current AAA Ltd. Showing Rules Manual. Exhibitors must be current financial members of the Australian Alpaca Association and alpacas be registered on the International Alpaca Register (IAR).

All exhibitors should read the conditions (1 -4) on the entry form and ensure that they can comply with those conditions before signing the entry form, particularly noting the condition dealing with animal health. A separate health declaration will be provided for signature and return with the entry form. Failure to sign the entry form will render all alpacas of an exhibitor ineligible to be exhibited. Please note that only the registered owner of an exhibit, or his/her authorised agent may sign an entry form. The registered owner of an exhibit must be a financial member of the AAA Ltd. Alpacas travelling interstate must comply with that State's Department of Industry requirements.

PERIOD OF EXHIBITION

Alpacas must be penned by 8 am on Saturday 18 June 2011 at the Equestrian Centre, Werribee and may not be removed from the pavilion before 4:00pm or such earlier time as may be announced by the show convener on Sunday 19 June 2011.

All exhibitors are required to assist in the removal and re-packing of panels and other show set-up items before they depart from the show premises. All panels must be repacked on the racks, rubbish removed from the pavilion, fleece boxes repacked, judging ring cleaned and carpets and bunting returned to the WRAG float before exhibitors leave the WPNEC.

ARRIVAL

Alpacas may arrive at the following times:

- Friday 17 June 5:00pm – 9:00pm
- Saturday 18 June – 6:00am – 7:45am

Early arrival on Friday 17 June (between 3:00pm and 5:00pm) may be possible **only by prior arrangement with the convener.**

Alpacas must be penned by 8:00am, Saturday 18 June

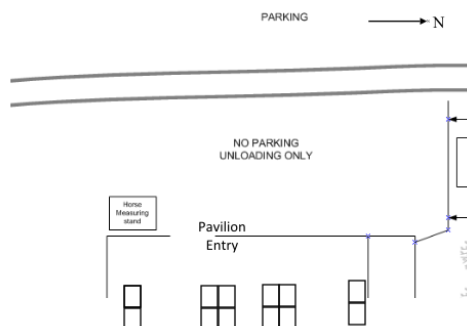
PENNING

All exhibitors shall, on the day of the Show, obtain their pen position and animal exhibit card numbers from the Shed Steward. The animal exhibit number card of the exhibit must be worn and clearly displayed by the handler whilst in the show ring. The age of the alpaca, in months, will be displayed on the card.

All exhibitors must place their animals in the pens allotted by the Show Stewards and must not be moved or removed except by order of the Chief Steward.

PARKING

Parking is permitted on the west side of the access road. Trucks, floats and cars may NOT be parked on the apron area to the pavilion.



PREPARATION OF EXHIBITS AND CLEANLINESS OF STALLS

Exhibitors must keep the pens allotted to their animals clean, and give proper attention to their stock throughout the Show. Exhibitors must provide their own feed, and feed and water containers. **Exhibitors must not vary their pen allocation without the approval of the Chief Steward.**

RUBBISH

The cost of removing rubbish from the pavilion is enormous.

- Rubbish such as cups, cans, paper, metal, and similar matter **MUST** be placed in the bins provided.
- Straw from animal pens **MUST NOT** BE PLACED IN WHEELIE BINS but **MUST** be placed in the skip located outside the pavilion.

Exhibitors **MUST NOT MIX** straw cleaned from pens with other rubbish.

ADVERTISING

Small folders attached to the front of the animal pen are permitted for promotional and sales material otherwise no sale advertising or notices (except with the permission of Chief Steward) are permitted on or in any stalls or buildings.

Sale signs are permitted only in designated "trade" pens.

Banners promoting stud names are welcome, but must be contained to the bounds of the pen and to a height of 2000 mm on the rear of a pen – ie not along walkways.

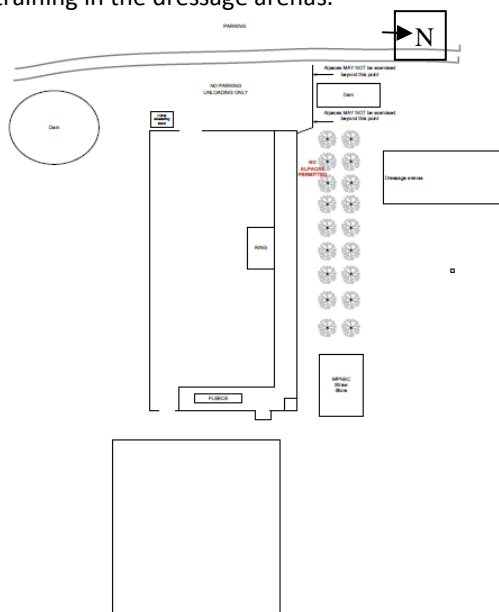
Display of Show ribbons awarded at a Show held at another venue is prohibited.

No identification of a stud may be displayed on a handler in the marshalling area or, particularly, in the judging ring. A handler shall be deemed to be incorrectly attired if his/her dress or the animal being led displays any information capable of being construed as advertising for any stud.

EXERCISING & DRYING OF ANIMALS

Alpacas may be exercised and taken outside to dry fleeces at any time at the discretion of the exhibitor within the permitted area only. This is on the west side (road and parking area side) of the pavilion. As dressage and other equestrian training activities are conducted at the same times as the alpacas are present for the show, alpacas **may not be exercised** on the north side of the pavilion other than along the roadway. Exercise to the south of the pavilion is permitted always recognising that, given the nature of the venue, horses and riders must be avoided (horses may react adversely to the alpacas and most of the riders that may be on site are young and may not be sufficiently experienced to handle any reaction from their mounts).

On no circumstances may the alpacas be exercised at any location where they may be seen by any rider using and training in the dressage arenas.



COMPANION ANIMALS

Special permission to bring a companion alpaca must be obtained from the Convenor or Chief Steward before submitting the entry form, otherwise no companion alpacas will be permitted.

DOGS

No dogs are permitted into the precinct where Show animals are being penned or shown in the ring. Guide Dogs are exempt.

INSPECTION OF EXHIBITS

Alpacas must be penned and available for inspection no later than 8:00am on Saturday 18 June. Wherever possible inspections will be undertaken on Friday afternoon/evening. Alpacas (including wethers) must be registered with the Australian Alpaca Association Ltd. and carry an approved brass tag showing the alpaca's IAR number.

No animal shall be eligible for exhibition if it is not entire (except for wethers in wether classes). All genitalia shall be complete, properly formed and proportioned for normal reproduction.

The Convenor, in consultation with the Show Committee of a Show conducted under Association Rules, shall appoint a person, or persons, as a qualified inspector, or inspectors, who shall inspect all alpacas for genetic faults, colour class and IAR number and visible physical disfigurement.

NOTE: If there is no IAR tag present in the ear of an animal exhibit, official Association confirmation must be provided by the owner to the Chief Steward that the ear tag has been recently lost and that a new tag has been ordered and paid for. Replacement tag orders and payments must be lodged with the National Office a minimum of one week before the date of the show. Failure to present such advice at inspection will result in disqualification of the animal.

The Inspector or Chief Steward will classify all entries for age, sex and colour and has the power to transfer an exhibit to the class which, in his/her opinion, it should have been entered. The Chief Steward will combine or split classes as he/she sees fit.

The inspection of alpacas will start on Friday 17 as exhibitors arrive and continue from at 8 am on Saturday 18 June 2011.

*Alpacas not in their allocated pens and available for inspection at the official time may be disqualified by the Chief Steward. Exhibitors **must** be in attendance at the time of the inspection and will be required to assist.*

Exhibits of huacayas must carry a minimum fleece length of 50 mm and a recommended maximum length not exceeding 130 mm. The minimum fleece length for suris is 75 mm and fleece length will be assessed by the Judge.

Exhibits shall not have fleece of a different colour to that of the blanket removed from an animal to a level below that of the blanket fleece.

Any alpaca found to have lice infestation must be removed from the showgrounds immediately along with any other alpacas present that belong to the same exhibitor.

SIRES PROGENY

Sires Progeny classes will be offered for both Huacaya and Suri for three progeny from a sire.

There must be at least two entries (groups) in order for the class to be conducted. The progeny may be males and/or females but cannot include wethers. The progeny need not be owned or bred by the one exhibitor, however they must be drawn from the ordinary age based classes - ie all progeny must have been entered as animal exhibits in the 2011 AlpacaFest Premier Alpaca Show. Entries will be made on the day. The entry fee per group will be \$15.00.

Only one progeny from any one dam may be shown in each sires progeny class unless the progeny have been born at least eleven months apart

DAM'S PROGENY CLASSES

For two progeny from the same dam.

A Dam's Progeny entry may be a pair of females, males, or female and male (not wethers). The progeny need not be owned or bred by the one exhibitor, but must be the progeny of the same dam. Alpacas entered for the Dam's Progeny class must have been entered as animal exhibits in the 2011 AlpacaFest Premier Alpaca Show. Alpacas entered for the Dam's Progeny class may have the same sire or different sires and must have been born at least eleven months apart. There must be at least two entries (groups) in order for the class to be conducted.

Entries close for Dam's Progeny Groups at a time determined by the Chief Steward. Only one entry per group is required. The entry fee per group will be \$10.00.

FANS

While many breeders are keen to use fans to keep their alpacas dry, the provision does create a range of issues for organisers. OH&S rules require that no leads are on the ground -even if covered - and all leads MUST have a current tag showing they have been checked by a qualified electrician. Power outlets must be arranged with adequate supply.

*Only breeders who have indicated on their entry forms that they wish to bring and use a fan and have paid the designated fee **per fan** (\$20.00 per fan) may do so. Fans must be presented to the Electrical Services Steward for checking and tagging prior to their use, and only designated power outlets may be used.*

The availability of power for fans cannot, of course, be guaranteed as it depends on the overall power supply made available for the competition. Every effort will be made to satisfy requests for power supply for fans.

It is intended that exterior doors will, with appropriate barriers, remain open overnight to ensure best possible ventilation throughout the pavilion.

AGE OF ALPACA

The reference date for determining the age of an alpaca is Saturday 18 June 2011.

SECURITY

A security person will be on duty in the pavilion overnight. No-one will be admitted to the pavilion between its close on Friday night and 5:00am Saturday morning, or 8:00pm on Saturday evening and 5:00am on Sunday morning.

AGISTMENT

Short-term agistment for alpacas can be made available on request.

MISCONDUCT OF EXHIBITORS AND MEMBERS

A violation of any rule by the Exhibitor shall be reported to the Chief Steward in writing by either the Judge, a steward or exhibitor within one hour of the alleged incident occurring.

Misconduct may also be reported by the Judge, a Steward or Exhibitor to the Chief Steward in respect of actions of an exhibitor or member present at the Show that is considered to be prejudicial to the industry. Such actions may include but not be limited to: a) A demonstration of dissatisfaction with a Judge's decision, including refusal to accept an award. b) Altercations with Show Officials, Exhibitors or the general public. c) Abusive or foul language or rude gestures in public and the mistreatment of an animal.

Written complaints shall be lodged with the Chief Steward within one hour of the alleged incident occurring. Written complaints received by the Chief Steward shall be immediately investigated and if sufficient grounds for the complaint are confirmed the matter shall be reported to the AAA National Secretary for appropriate action under the AAA Grievance Procedure.

JUDGING

A competitor may not discuss with the Judge their alpacas or proposed exhibits before or during the Show judging.

The Judge's decision shall be final. He/she may choose not to award a prize or prizes in a class.

All handlers showing animals must be competent in the handling of their exhibit, or removal from the ring may be requested by the Judge. It is recommended that small children not exhibit large animals that they cannot control.

DRESS CODE IN JUDGING RING

All attendants leading stock in the judging ring or parade shall wear a white coat over dark coloured long trousers or long skirts, with clean dark coloured dress shoes or boots. Hats may not be worn in the judging ring. The Chief Steward may disqualify an exhibitor for incorrect attire.

SUPREME AND PREMIER COLOUR

In "Age Championship" shows, AAA rules provide for the judging of the Supreme Huacaya and Suri from the winners of each appropriate type age section. "Best of Colour" may be judged after determination of the Supreme Huacaya or Suri from the first placed animals in the various colours.

AlpacaFest, as an "Age Championship" show, will award Supreme Huacaya / Suri to the animal adjudged the best from the champions for each age section.

Additionally, AlpacaFest will judge and award the best male/female from the first placed alpacas for each colour category and the "Premier" Colour will be adjudged from the best male and female for the particular colour.

The winner of **Supreme Huacaya** and **Supreme Suri** will automatically be declared **Premier** colour for their colour.

FLEECES

Premier Fleece Show.

All fleeces being exhibited (including wether fleeces) must be the bona fide property of an AAA Ltd. financial member and must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.

Only one fleece that has been shorn in the 18 months before the Show may be shown from any one animal. It is recommended that fleeces be placed in bags, made of satin or similar material, or heavy duty plastic. Plastic garbage bags should be avoided.

Exhibitors, when submitting fleeces at the Show, must attach to the fleece bag the number for that class identified in the catalogue and clearly identify on the outside of the bag the exhibitor and exhibit name. No names or other identifying information should be inside the bag.

"Supreme" winning Huacaya and Suri fleeces will also each receive 2 Show Fleece Bags courtesy of **Brumosa Azul**.

PERSONAL OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATION:

Exhibitor's Code of Conduct

1. The Exhibitor's Code of Conduct is effective during all stages of an AAA Ltd. endorsed show including, but not exclusively limited to the planning, preparation, co-ordination, set-up, actual day of the Show and post show clean up, dismantling and wrap up.
2. Participants shall not engage in the following activities or behaviours during any stage of an AAA Ltd endorsed show:
 - a. Negative, obstructive or disruptive behaviour.
 - b. Abusive or foul language, rude gestures in public or whilst dealing with any show officials and/or AAA Ltd. staff or members.
 - c. Cruelty and mistreatment of alpacas.
 - d. Lack of compliance with AAA Ltd. Showing Rules including attempts to circumvent rules or procedures.
 - e. Falsification of information required by the show including but not limited to: entry information, disclosure statements, shearing dates, dates of birth, registration certificates or ownership of alpacas.
3. Participants shall be courteous and gracious to judges, officials and fellow exhibitors at all times, regardless of class placements.
4. Shows are public events; therefore, all show participants should at all times conduct themselves in a positive, professional and courteous manner. For those entering the ring clothing should be neat and professional and be consistent with the dress code for the individual show.
5. Show participants are assumed to know all AAA Ltd. showing rules. Such individuals who voluntarily elect to participate in AAA Ltd. endorsed shows do so with the understanding that they are bound by these rules and are liable to incur disciplinary action for infringement of them.
6. Participants will ensure that all pen panels, fleece judging boxes and equipment, and other equipment used to support the show is packed away to the satisfaction of the Convener and Chief Steward before they depart from the showgrounds
7. Breaches in any of the above may result in a protest or report being filed by the Chief Steward for breaches on the day of the show or by the Show Convener or Regional President for breaches other than on the day of the show. The protest or report will be filed with the AAA Ltd. for consideration of disciplinary action.

HUACAYA SECTIONS

Note: Huacaya 12 months and older must be shorn regularly so that no more than 15 months fleece is carried at the time of showing.
Winners of Best Fancy and Best Wether are not eligible for Supreme Champion Huacaya
